

South Wagga Public School Home Learning Procedure

Developed Term 4 2023

INTRODUCTION

The NSW Department of Education specifies that a school's home learning Policy should be:

- Relevant to the needs of students.
- Developed in consultation with key school community stakeholders including teachers, parents/caregivers and students.
- Communicated to staff, students, parents/caregivers.
- In developing their Home Learning Policy, schools should be aware that while the Policy itself is compulsory, the setting of home learning and any indicative time allocations across year levels are not.

This approach to developing a Home Learning Policy is in line with several factors:

- Community expectations about home learning are variable.
- Research regarding the value of home learning is inconclusive.
- Schools are best placed to make decisions about home learning in consultation with their communities.

RATIONALE

The South Wagga Public School community recognises that while home learning is an important aspect of schooling, students also need to have time to spend with their family as well as time for play and cultural and physical activities outside of school. South Wagga Public School believe that:

- Daily reading should be a compulsory component of home learning.
- Project based Learning brings real-life context and technology to the curriculum. Students are encouraged to become independent workers, critical thinkers and lifelong learners.
- Literacy and numeracy activities should reflect an individual student's abilities and be designed to assist in progression. These activities should be optional.

RESPONSIBILITY

For the successful implementation of this policy, the responsibilities of our school community are:

- Teachers are to follow school home learning guidelines to promote consistency across the school. Additionally, it is the responsibility of teachers to work with students and parents to meet individual needs and provide additional support through home learning as required.
- Students are to complete the home learning tasks assigned by their teacher, including daily reading in line with policy expectations.
- Parents are to support their children in their understanding that home learning set by the teacher is highly recommended as it consolidates learning from the classroom. Parents are encouraged to be actively involved with their child's home learning. This should include supporting daily reading in line with policy expectations.



IMPLEMENTATION

Students will be set home learning based on the following guidelines:
