School Safety

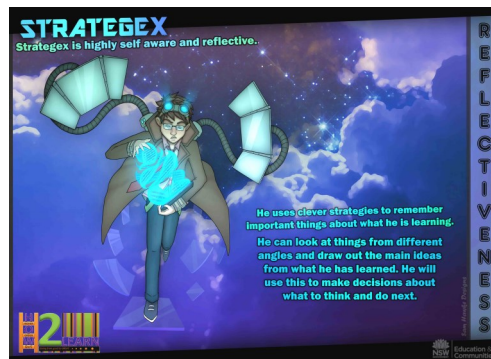

Notice from Wagga Wagga City Council Traffic Officer



If parents could be reminded that under the ROAD RULES 2014 - REG 170 – When stopping in or near an intersection a driver must not stop on a road within 10 metres from the nearest point of an intersecting road at an intersection. If a No Stopping sign exists, the offence occurs under ROAD RULES 2014 - REG 167 – in that a driver must not stop on a length of road in an area to which a No Stopping sign applies. If parents could please be advised of these regulations it would be appreciated as there has been recent reports of incidences occurring in Little Best Street at the intersection of Best Street. It should be noted that such offences can incur a penalty and associated penalties may increase within school zones, including loss of driver points.
