Child Protection & Physical Development and Health (PDH): Growing & Changing

In government schools, child protection education and Growing & Changing forms part of all students learning in Personal Development Health and Physical Education from Kindergarten to Year 10. Our school will be teaching child protection in term 4. Students learn skills in recognising if they could be unsafe and strategies for protecting themselves. Strategies including saying 'no' if they can, going away from the situation and telling a trusted adult what has happened as soon as possible. Learning is organised into three themes: Recognising Abuse; Power in Relationships and Protective Strategies.
